### **Custer State Park Trails**

From 9 July to 6 August 2023, the U.S. Marine Corps Reserve led a joint construction mission in partnership with Custer State Park and the Active Duty U.S. Marine Corps.

The mission in Custer State Park offered a unique opportunity for participants to train in various engineering tasks, such as road improvement, graveling, grading, and bridge repair. Marines felled trees, built non-standard bridges, and

constructed a road from scratch. Marines operated more equipment for longer hours than they ever would in a normal drill setting or service-level exercise annual training.

This mission had a positive impact on park employees and visitors. It resulted in safer access to Buffalo Corral Road and improved the safety of the Mickelson Bridge for cyclists, runners, and walkers. The park's trail enhancements enable visitors to access previously unreachable areas, and the newly constructed picnic pavilion provides protection from inclement weather. Tree clearing and vegetation land improvements mitigated Firewise forest-fire brush and vegetation fuel removal.

The services rendered to the park had an estimated value of over \$600,000 and included a range of notable accomplishments. These included operating engineering equipment for 475 hours, grading 140 miles, moving 6,500 cubic feet of earth, installing 2,100 tons of rock, removing 3,000 trees and 9 acres of vegetation, enhancing 10 miles of trails, and constructing 12 water crossings.

This successful collaboration exemplifies how IRT partnerships benefit communities and contribute to unit readiness through real-world mission training. Learn more about our program at irt.defense.gov.
