A Legacy of Leadership: Celebrating the Journey of Colonel George Koklanaris, USA, Retired

This month, we recognize the career of our esteemed former IRT Deputy Director, Colonel George Koklanaris, who retired on February 1. We highlight and celebrate the remarkable legacy he leaves for the Innovative Readiness Training program as well as in numerous military and civilian assignments prior.

COL Koklanaris joined IRT in early 2017 as an Individual Mobilization Augmentee supporting the Reserve Integration office in the Office of the Undersecretary of Defense/Manpower & Reserve Affairs and has since been an integral part of the office's success in executing Civil Military Programs (CMP). His dedication, expertise, and leadership have been instrumental in shaping the direction and growth of the CMP portfolio. COL Koklanaris has served at the pleasure of

the IRT Director, most recently as the IRT Deputy Director.

In this role, he has demonstrated exceptional skills and commitment through transformative efforts to impart operational effectiveness throughout the IRT program. He inarguably provided continuity of leadership by assuming this role during the COVID-19 pandemic. In support of these efforts, he instituted business rhythm processes, such as the biweekly status report (WSR) and accompanying biweekly meeting series between OSD leadership and the IRT Joint Service Program Managers. These tools increased internal communications and transparency between IRT program management staff while directly benefitting mission outcomes. In addition, he created and championed an enhanced Managers' Internal Control Program framework, effectively managing and mitigating risks for use of program resources by implementing a rigorous set of control factors. Through his exemplary leadership, COL Koklanaris set a high standard for quality, accountability, and audit readiness for those who will follow.

Another pursuit about which COL Koklanaris has been passionate is the portfolio's expansion into the Indo-Pacific theater. Through his shepherding of this theater's strategic importance, the IRT program has several recently completed, as well as ongoing, applications for upcoming civil military training opportunities in the Indo-Pacific area of operations, including a medical training mission in Guam in FY23, medical and civil engineering missions in the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands in FY23, multiple missions in Hawaii, and forthcoming prospective missions in American Samoa. These training activities are a priority in IRT as they support strategic objectives around coalition building and provide joint-training opportunities, including logistical and environmental factors that mimic deployment conditions.

Beyond his professional achievements, COL Koklanaris has been a mentor and friend to many. His presence will be greatly missed but his legacy will continue to inspire the mission, community partners, and Service Members of many more IRT civil miliary partnerships to come. As we bid farewell to COL Koklanaris, we express our deepest gratitude for his invaluable contributions to our organization. We wish him all the best in his well-deserved retirement.

Program Manager of the Year is awarded to Air Force Reserve Senior Master Sergeant (SMSgt.) James Pegg for his outstanding leadership as the Consolidated Asset Management Site's Officer in Charge. SMSgt. Pegg led coordinated efforts for all service components to receive functional and service ready assets. Under his leadership, SMSgt. Pegg spearheaded a \$190,000 design for additional non-functional food service trailers that improved feeding capabilities on missions that resulted in \$2 million in savings for military department funding. His strategic thinking helped transform the IRT program by instituting a more streamlined and standardized asset request process. This award was presented by the Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defense for Reserve Integration, Mr. Judd Lyons, joined by IRT Director, Colonel Jaclyn Chatwick.
