# CAMS Hosts Successful Two-Part Training Workshop

The Innovative Readiness Training (IRT) Consolidated Asset Management Site (CAMS) hosted two medical workshops in March the first on March 13-14 and the second on March 19-20. These critical learning forums familiarized 46 joint personnel participating in IRT medical missions with CAMS medical, dental, and optometric equipment and assets. The training included how to assemble and disassemble equipment during deployment and redeployment. Attendees received hands-on experience with the equipment, learning proper use and inventory

procedures for before and after missions. The workshop included tours of CAMS facilities and breakout sessions for service component medical planning teams.

The CAMS operation plays a crucial role in supporting IRT missions by managing and providing established medical equipment kits, civil engineering equipment packages, and general base support items, such as kitchen trailers, mobile gyms, and tactical communication equipment. These predictable, repeatable, and reliable equipment kits and packages enable effective training and mission execution. CAMS personnel actively assist and participate in IRT mission planning to ensure equipment availability and train mission participants on the proper use and accountability of assets. In addition, CAMS personnel coordinate and execute the delivery of assets to locations in the continental United States and assist IRT program managers and mission planners with deliveries by military airlift for missions in geographically separated U.S. territories.

Asset Management plays an integral role in the IRT Program, as evidenced in part by CAMS providing Service Members with the equipment and supplies they need to train successfully and serve communities across America effectively. The asset management portfolio at CAMS is valued at \$17 million, consisting of \$12 million in medical equipment, \$3 million in civil engineering equipment, and \$2 million in base support. In fiscal year (FY) 2023, CAMS personnel deployed, delivered, and redeployed assets to 17 locations via ground transport over 88,000 miles. In FY24, IRT asset management will support more than 20 locations, including remote sites of care in Hawaii, Alaska, and territories in the Pacific.
