Providing Lasting Benefits for the Community



More than 50 Active Duty and Army Reserve Soldiers joined the Delta Regional Authority and other community partners, June 18-27, to lead South East Illinois IRT, a medical Innovative Readiness Training (IRT) mission in Harrisburg, IL. South East Illinois IRT provided training

opportunities for the military's medical providers, while simultaneously delivering basic medical, dental and optometry services at no cost to community members.

The mission presented unique opportunities for Soldiers to practice medicine in settings with limited infrastructure. The participating units traditionally work in established hospitals and clinics, but this change of mission required Soldiers to set up temporary centers with transportable

medical equipment in community buildings. "Limited resources and time forces our providers out of their comfort zone, and to learn by facing new challenges," said First Lieutenant Cassie Donahue, the mission's Field Medical Assistant. In these clinics, doctors and nurses provided medical exams, health education, referrals and prescriptions. The optometry clinic

provided eye exams and prescription glasses, while dentists and dental technicians provided general exams, cleanings and extractions.

Although the mission is over, the broad reach and impact in the region is enduring. Ms. Kari Lane, a South East Illinois volunteer coordinator and staff member from Egyptian Health, saw patients coming from over 100 miles away to access the medical, dental and optometry services. "Our population's quality of life has improved because of the IRT mission," said Ms. Lane. "The care people received, whether from removing a painful tooth or seeing with a new pair of glasses, is something that they feel grateful for and will remember."
