IRT Missions in the Pacific Provide Care While Conducting Training

Aloha Gardens

Approximately 200 Air National Guardsmen and Marine Corps Reservists spent the months of May and June partnering with Helemano Plantation, a not-for-



profit organization that provides recreational and residential support to the elderly and individuals with developmental disabilities. This mission served to conduct construction and electrical training and provide communal housing to the plantation employees. Led by the Air National Guard, this training mission completed three 2,500 square foot duplex structures, collectively referred to as "Anuenue Hale", translated from the Hawaiian language to mean "Rainbow House". According to the plantation director, Susanna F. Cheung, Helemano offers training, employment "real-world opportunities, and а work environment for the developmentally disabled." IRT training assists the Helemano Plantation in realizing its vision to provide housing for

individuals with disabilties, who are at-risk of being homeless.

Tropic Care Hawaii

More than 80 Soldiers from the Army Reserve's 1984th US Army Hospital (USAH), based in Honolulu, Hawaii, partnered with the Hawaii County Department of Health, Kea'au High School, and the local Lions Club, to host the Tropic Care Hawaii medical mission on Hilo, the "Big Island", June 18-28th. Soldiers conducted hands-on medical, dental, and optometry training while providing services at no cost to residents of the island.

The mission was a success, completing nearly 1,100 hours of training. Tropic Care Hawaii was the first IRT experience for many members of the 1984th USAH, but according Captain Zachary Van Zanten, Operations Officer, the mission was threatened by, and almost cancelled because of volcanic activity less than 12 miles from the training site. "Due to challenges with the lava flow, original plans to stage the mission at the Kilauea Military Camp had to be scrapped and an alternate location utilized". Captain Van Zanten and his team coordinated and executed a contingency plan to partner with the University of Hawaii at Hilo, which provided meals and lodging for mission participants, allowing the Tropic Care Hawaii IRT to train and serve the community uninterrupted.

INNOVATIVE READINESS TRAINING



Tropic Care Maui County

Nearly 400 service members established six medical care sites across the islands of Maui, Molokai, and Lanai during the Tropic Care Maui County IRT, August 8-22nd. In partnership with Maui County, the Air National Guard, supported by the Army (Active Duty), Marine Corps (Reserve), Navy (Active Duty & Reserve), and Air Force (Active Duty), conducted more than 18,000 medical, dental, and optometry procedures via 5,600 patient encounters. The mission was bookended by hurricanes Hector and Lane, respectively, delaying mission participants' arrival to Maui, and forcing them to depart the island ahead of schedule. Emergency response planning and operations added value to the training during the mission. According to Captain Jennifer Fagan, OSD IRT Operations Officer, "Members participating in this mission received training in leadership, unit tasks, and individual tasks. In addition to the standard training, two hurricanes threatened the island and mission, giving members an opportunity to manage real-world threats in a greater capacity than a normal annual training would require."

considerations in contingency planning, but the steps necessary to overcome the challenges to the Tropic Care Maui County mission are generally outside the scope of a medical planner. Real-world occurrences required real-world responses, and according to Captain Fagan, "Members went above and beyond by staying mission-focused while preparing for potential natural disasters."
