Marines to Improve Catalina Island Runway

U.S. Marines (Marine Wing Support Squadron (MWSS), Marine Wing Support Group (MWSG) 37, 3rd Marine Aircraft Wing (MAW)), and Navy Seabees (Naval Construction Group 1 (NCG1), 1st Naval Construction Regiment (1NCR), Naval Mobile Construction Battalions 5 and 18 (NMCB 5, NMCB 18)) have begun an IRT

mission in partnership with the Catalina Island Conservancy to make crticial improvements to Catalina Island's 75 year old runway. The Marines and Navy Seabees will repave the 3,000 foot-long runway with concrete. The project is scheduled to finish by April 2019. The project brings

significant value to the local community as well as to the Marines and Seabees. During the project, the military personnel operate out of an austere tent camp, just as they would during an expeditionary military operation. "The repair of the Conservancy's Airport in the Sky runway project offers an incredible training opportunity to the Marines," U.S. Marine Corps Lieutenant Colonel Duncan Buchanan, a spokesperson for the I Marine Expeditionary Force (MEF), the higher headquarters for the 3rd MAW, said in a statement on Oct. 30, 2018. "This challenging project allows Marines to gain valuable experience in repairing damaged runways, and increases our capabilities and readiness to tackle a range of military operations across the globe. It also ensures that the community benefits from a fully operational airport for daily provisions as well as to aid in any potential recovery efforts after natural disasters." ²

"Our collaboration with the U.S. Marines is a rare opportunity to maintain the proud history we share on Catalina," Tony Budrovich, Catalina Conservancy's President and CEO, said in a statement on Oct. 30, 2018. "We invite Island residents and visitors to come to the airport during construction to observe this exceptional military exercise and enjoy the beauty and the open spaces of Catalina's interior."3
