Mississippi's Toughest Kids Camp Kamassa

From March 4 through July 28, 2019 Service Members from units across the U.S. Marine Corps Forces Reserves, U.S. Air Force Reserve, and the Air National Guard will continue work begun in 2018 to support the construction of Camp Kamassa, Mississippi's first and only year-round handicap accessible camp facility for children and adults with serious illnesses, physical and mental challenges and other special needs, in Crystal Springs, Mississippi. This three-year IRT project began in 2018 when Service members cleared approximately 50 acres of land, laid site utilities, built a maintenance pole barn, and prepped for the construction of a recreation building and cabins. The 2019 project will include construction of a bridge over a small creek, laying additional site utilities, and construction of eight duplex cabins and construction of a multipurpose building (which will include a dance hall, indoor rock climbing wall, teaching kitchen, library, and classrooms).
