IRT Mission Builds Camp Paumalu's STEM Center of Excellence

From 08 April – 25 August 2019, the Air National Guard led the Camp Paumaulu IRT mission in partnership with the Girl Scouts of Hawai'i (GSH). This joint Civil Engineering mission brought together supporting units from the Air Force Reserve Command and the Marine Corps Reserves to construct a new 11,603 square foot Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) Center for Excellence. The Center will be an integral part of Camp Paumalu, a 135-acre camp located on the North Shore of Oahu, Hawai'i.

The mission builds on the success of a multi-year partnership with the GSH. This year's mission met crucial Mission Essential Task List (METL) training requirements across twelve functional areas in support of vegetation removal, demolition, roadway and drainage improvements, building foundation construction, carpentry, and other modern construction practices in a safe and controlled environment. Special training opportunities beyond the traditional scope of civil engineering included mobilization and operation of a Disaster Relief Mobile Kitchen Trailer (DRMKT) and obtaining a Route

Leading the mission was Officer in Charge (OIC) First Lieutenant Emelia Brooks of the Air National Guard. She played an integral and vital role throughout the lifecylce of the project. While coordinating complex military and construction project logistics, she served alongside the community partner leadership team that included the GSH Chief Executive Officer, Lead Architect, Design Engineer,

Lead Estimator, and Field Engineer. With Lt Brooks' oversight, the mission provided just over 48,578 training hours; enhancing unit readiness while delivering valuable capital contributions to the camp and community alike. Once the facility is complete, more than 2,000 girls annually from across the U.S. will have access to hands-on training in cyber security, astronomy, robotics, computer coding, botany, chemistry, and environmental stewardship. Mission participants left this year's mission with bolstered readiness for their duties down range.
