An Exciting Year Ahead—FY 2020 IRT Missions

Following the success of our FY 2019 mission season, the Innovative Readiness Training (IRT) program is well underway with FY 2020 planning. This year, Servicemembers of the Army, Army Reserve, and Army National Guard; Marine Corps Reserve; Navy Reserve; and Air National Guard, and Air Force Reserve will conduct 22 missions funded by the Office of the Secretary of Defense (OSD).

This past fall, IRT leaders completed initial planning meetings. Before mission execution, they will hold mid planning and final planning meetings in the winter and spring. This three-part planning process not only ensures mission success, but provides mission-essential training to participants. They work through all elements of mission planning to identify and resolve potential

issues such as bed-down locations, clinic sites, food services, as well as review all site concerns, such as communications or transportation considerations.

This year's OSD-funded missions consist of 10 construction, 9 medical, 1 transportation, 1 civil affairs, and 1 diving. We anticipate the involvement of over 5,000 Servicemembers, representing solid joint participation across the Services and Components.

This 3-year mission focuses on training in horizontal and vertical construction practices. In July, IRT will also conduct a medical mission, Mississippi Medical, in Crystal Springs, as well as nearby Mendenhall and Magee, where the community will receive no-cost medical, dental, and optometry services.
