Operation Gateway Delivers Medical Training

From 9–22 July, the U.S. Air Force Reserve led Operation Gateway in partnership with the Kentucky Department for Local Government. This joint medical mission supplied no-cost healthcare services to residents in the Gateway Area Development District (GADD) of Kentucky. Supporting units from the Army Reserve, Marine Corps Reserve, Navy Reserve, and Air National Guard trained in multiple medical occupational specialties, including optometry, dietary, dentistry, pharmacology, aerospace medicine, medical service management, and general medicine.

This civil-military partnership in Kentucky furnished training to Service Members that replicated deployment conditions while delivering care to 2,579 patients across multiple sites in five rural counties: Bath,

Menifee, Montgomery, Morgan, and Rowan. The services benefited a region defined by the Appalachian Regional Commission as economically distressed with unemployment levels higher than the national average and many residents lacking access to basic healthcare services. The training provided and care administered built on prior IRT successes in partnership with the Kentucky Department for Local Government, including Operation Coal Country in 2019 and Operation Bobcat in 2018.

This partnership displays the value that civil-military collaboration delivers to American communities. This year's project brought together Service Members to complete a total of 12,606 procedures—3,347 for optometry, 4,395 for dental, and 4,864 for medical—amounting to \$1,025,578 in community benefit. A staggering 1,078 pairs of single-prescription eyeglasses were prepared and distributed over the course of the two-week mission. During this exercise, community members gained increased health education and awareness through patient counseling.

Like those before and yet to come, this mission's training opportunities are unique in the Department of Defense. IRT training is hands-on, takes place in complex environments, and offers Joint services experience. Learn more about our program at irt.defense.gov.
