Community Application Process and Significance

Innovative Readiness Training (IRT) is a collaborative program that leverages community resources and military contributions to multiply value and cost savings for all participants. This civilmilitary partnership program provides an opportunity for American communities to receive lasting benefits in areas of health care, construction, civil affairs, cybersecurity, aerial spraying, transportation, and diving while military personnel receive hands-on, real-world training to improve deployment readiness and survivability.



Effective IRT missions begin with a strong community application.

This civil-military partnership program requires applications from both the community requesting assistance and one or more of the joint-service components. In this month's article, we focus on providing instructions to complete the community application and additional tips to create a high-quality submission.

The process begins by visiting <u>irt.defense.gov</u> and selecting the 'Apply Now' button on the homepage. As a new applicant, select the 'Click here to create your Community Member account' button to sign up. It is important to submit your application on time to be eligible. For example, the deadline for community applications for missions occurring in fiscal year (FY) 2025 is September 30, 2023.

The community application requires basic information, such as community name and address, type of mission requested, and mission location(s). It then requires more specific information, such as the estimated mission length, coordinated funding or support, available no-cost facilities, interested parties, local government support, and a brief description of the proposed scope of work. For a strong application, it is important to write concise but targeted responses detailing:

- 1. How this mission contributes to the long-term or broader vision of an American community and fits the training needs of military personnel
- 2. The beneficiaries of this mission and when they will begin to benefit
- 3. The capacity to sustain the tangible value created by this mission
- 4. The potential of this mission in creating a positive civil-military relationship.

Lastly, be sure to include contact information and electronically sign the document prior to submission.
