Tennessee Camp Construction Delivers Training Value to the Army Reserve

From 20 March to 1 April 2024, the U.S. Army Reserve led a civil engineering mission in partnership with the Boy Scouts of America, Sequoyah Council, at Camp Davy Crockett in Whitesburg, Tennessee. This exercise cleared sites and prepared activities for facilities while training participants in engineering, project management, and nontactical convoy movements.

This effort is projected to have trained 40 officers and 460 enlisted Service Members from the 844th Engineering Battalion. Soldiers

completed three high-value, high-impact construction elements to enhance the camping experience for the scouts. Accomplishments included constructing a new 1,200 square foot, seven-bay shower facility, remodeling of a 5,200 square foot dining hall into a new five classroom science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) educational facility, and creating an 18-acre pistol range, encompassing 33 bays.

Mission participants received training in numerous tasks across six military occupational specialties, including project management and staff operations. They blended operational evaluation involvement by requesting that members of the 1st Army Observer Controller/Trainers observe and advise on training during military decision-making process (MDMP) classes for the staff. Soldiers logged more than 7,500 training hours, including over 1,040 hours of heavy equipment usage, over 10 days.

Scout executive and chief executive officer Greg Leitch said, "This partnership with the Army Reserve [through IRT] creates opportunity for character education and life skill development on a grand scale. Our year-round facility annually impacts over 12,000 children from over 20 states. The expertise and support that comes from this partnership is invaluable to our growth potential as we build a values base in young people that allows them to become the future workforce leaders of America."

The vision for the camp and the scouts who use it is to expand STEM programs, enhance supporting facilities, and create what will be the largest pistol range in the country upon completion.
