Training with Purpose: Looking Ahead to FY26



The Innovative Readiness Training (IRT) Office of the Secretary of War team at the conclusion of the 2025 Joint Workshop for Operational Mission Planners and Mission Leads.

As we begin 2026, the IRT program is preparing for another impactful year of real-world military training. This year, IRT will execute 22 training activities funded by the Office of the Secretary of War (OSW) across 16 states and territories, along with 5 additional training activities across 4 states which are not funded by OSW. The program anticipates training approximately 2,300 Service members and expects more non-funded training opportunities to emerge in the coming months. These training activities will provide no-cost services ranging from optometry and dental care to specialized diving operations and cybersecurity expertise, while helping Service members hone critical skills in realistic deployment settings and deliver essential services to communities in need.

This January, mission planning is already in full swing, with several events underway. Details of these dates and missions are outlined on page 2. The 2026 training activities are progressing through IRT's three-phase planning process, mirroring real-world deployment preparation. The cycle begins with initial planning meetings where military units and community partners establish preliminary requirements and timelines. The mid-planning phase follows, focusing on refining logistics, securing bed-down locations, and finalizing clinic sites. The process culminates in final planning meetings to confirm personnel rosters, equipment needs, and coordination among all stakeholders. This structured approach ensures mission success while providing Service members with invaluable deployment-like training to enhance military readiness.

In addition, after-action reports from last year's training activities are being carefully reviewed and analyzed to inform planning and improve operational efficiencies. By applying lessons learned, the IRT program continues to strengthen the effectiveness of its training activities.

The IRT staff looks forward to supporting all participating units and community partners in 2026. IRT's civil-military partnerships continue to strengthen relationships between military members and American communities, enhance unit and deployment readiness for Service members, and address critical needs across the nation.
