Joint Force Teams Strengthen Guam Emergency Communications During Cyber Guam 2026

From June 1–12, 2026, the Air Force Reserve, supported by the Navy Reserve and Air Force Active Duty, partnered with the Government of Guam Office of Technology for an Innovative Readiness Training (IRT) cybersecurity support activity on the island of Guam. Sixty Service members worked side-by-side with their community counterparts, continuing a multi-year effort to assess physical and virtual network limitations, uncover vulnerabilities across critical systems, share cybersecurity best practices, strengthen Guam's emergency radio network, and train jointly with military and community stakeholders.

The initial exercise in 2024 mapped Guam's network architecture, reviewed policies, and established centralized authentication to provide local IT teams with greater visibility and control over their systems. In 2025, the partnership shifted toward securing identified assets and reducing vulnerabilities. This third iteration modernized critical infrastructure and built more resilient network and emergency communication capabilities.

Across the island, Cyber Guam 2026 participants were organized into radio, assessment, and network teams, operating in a fully joint environment that blended the skills and perspectives of Service members from multiple components.

Throughout the training, participants decommissioned obsolete equipment, tested emergency response communications, upgraded and deployed new network hardware, and assessed future upgrade needs. The exercise offered a rare opportunity for Service members to train on live, community networks rather than closed military systems, sharpening their technical skills in real-world conditions.

On June 8, a 7.8-magnitude earthquake off the coast of the Philippines triggered two tsunami advisories for Guam in the middle of the exercise. The event reinforced the critical need for reliable communications and highlighted the relevance of the radio team's efforts. Radio teams studied topographic maps of Guam to identify the island's highest points and establish feasible repeater sites to help military bases and municipalities maintain communications during natural disasters.

By the end of the training, Service members completed more than 2,000 training tasks; delivered an estimated fair market value of over \$600,000 in cybersecurity services and \$200,000 in emergency radio network survey services at no cost to the community; enabled live network training valued at roughly \$500,000; and plotted 520 emergency radio network sites across Guam.

Cyber Guam 2026 stands out as a clear example of how IRT advances national objectives, providing critical, real-world training to Service members while strengthening valued civil-military partnerships in the Indo-Pacific, a key strategic region under the 2026 National Defense Strategy.

IRT's civil-military partnerships continue to strengthen relationships between military members and American communities, enhance unit and deployment readiness for Service members, and provide essential services to local communities. To learn more, visit irt.defense.gov.

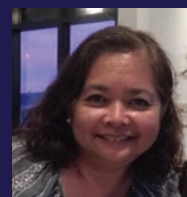
